Challenges or Opportunities Ahead?

On Trinity Sunday, 7th June, it will be 12 Sundays since the lockdown began and we were last able to worship in our Church buildings. I can't imagine any other period in history when this will have happened - maybe the black death - who knows?



There have been positives in the way Churches have responded by going wider using the Internet, and as well as getting people together from many different parts of the UK, we also have former Aytonians join us from Ireland, France and New Zealand! And we also had several people join us by telephone as they don't have Internet. (*Please see on Page 4 how you can do this.*)

It has been a hard time for many people as families have kept apart from each other, missing significant dates and some not being able to be present when loved ones died. Special birthdays and anniversaries have also been missed because of Coronavirus. Well done to all who have made such sacrifices to preserve the health of others. As restrictions are lifted we need to be even more careful so we don't go back to square one, and all need to act responsibly, especially Government Advisors and the media, for there is now a real danger of restrictions being ignored to all our detriments.

The financial effects of the lockdown will also add to the already gaping chasm between the rich and the poor. A frightening recent report in the Gazette said that 42% of children in Middlesbrough are now living below the breadline. This has increased from 27% over the last five years, and will likely increase even more when money given out has to be repaid. Sadly funding has gone from the Together Middlesbrough Organisation that paid for it's community worker.

There will be huge challenges ahead for many people within our communities and neighbourhoods, but also lots of opportunities for us to be people of the Kingdom of God seeking to bring his love, generosity and justice into the world. We need to look beyond ourselves and encourage all the good things happening. Keep well and keep safe.

Once again I have championed two very specific Christian charities for our Mission Giving – namely the Church Missionary Society and United Society Partners in the Gospel. My theory is that these very worthy charities will only be supported by churches and a relatively small number of Christian individuals.

Both charities support the marginalised and those living in poverty and we don't know what the full impact of Coronavirus will be. However, we do know that these people will be the hardest hit.

USPG was founded in 1701, as an Anglican mission agency that partnered churches and communities worldwide. They aim to make connections between the church



communities in Britain, Ireland and those overseas and seek ways in which to promote their work. They hope that the churches of the Anglican Communion will help them through prayer and financial donations in their struggles against injustices associated with gender, climate change, migration, the human rights of indigenous people and inter-religious living. They support Christians across the world to give hope and practical assistance.

In these challenging times they are operating in a variety of ways to ensure that their engagement with their global partners and supporters continues. They aim to bring hope for the future to the global communities they support.



CMS was begun over 200 years ago by a group of people which included William Wilberforce, John Venn and John Newton. Together they worked to abolish the slave trade, fight for the rights of oppressed people at home and began to take the Christian message to all parts of the globe.

Today there are CMS members in 40 countries across Africa, Asia, South America, the Middle East, Europe and the UK. Some have been sent from Britain and Europe, some have been sent by their local church in partnership with CMS and some through sister societies such as CMS-Africa and Asia CMS.



Their vision is to see "all God's people engaged in God's mission bringing challenge, change, hope and freedom to the world." Their work has seen how

- · the love of Christ renews people and places
- · pioneering leaders forge new paths of transformation
- · people on the margins flourish
- · the healing of creation begins

They hope that the churches involved will benefit from the links that have been established and encourage us to pray for their work as we discover more of what they do.
