


NEWS FROM THE PARISHES OF GREAT AYTON WITH EASBY & NEWTON UNDER ROSEBERRY

OUR CHURCHES SUPPORT OTHERS

As is customary, both parishes held Christmas appeals this year. Thank you to all of you who generously found the time, energy and money to think of others.

The recipient of this year's Christmas Appeal at Christ Church was "Embrace the Middle East", a Christian Charity which is working to provide relief to the many suffering from the conflicts in the Gaza and Lebanon. We raised a total of £1631.89 from Carol Services at Christ Church and All Saints and the ever-popular Crib Service on Christmas Eve. Although much smaller than in recent years our donation to "Embrace the Middle East" has been very well received.

Also, at Christmas we accept donations from those who support the **Memory Tree**. This year a total of £123.83 was raised for Heriot Hospice Homecare.

This year **St. Oswald's** PCC decided that the Christmas Appeal should be for a local children's charity, Zoe's Place. At the Carol Service a representative from Zoe's Place spoke briefly about the work of Zoe's Place and their ongoing need for funding. We were very pleased that £713.20 was raised for the charity during the Carol and Christmas Eve services. Zoe's Place was very grateful for the donation.

Jean Cumbor from Great Ayton made £1000 from selling her local photo calendars. It went to the Genesis Project in Grove Hill. She wishes to give her thanks to all who bought them.


HAVE SIX YEARS GONE BY SO SOON?

LENT "Forty days and forty nights, You were fasting in the wild..." As the hymn reminds us, Jesus spent time preparing for his final journey – his triumphal entry into Jerusalem, his painful death, then his glorious resurrection – and, in so doing, echoed both Moses and Elijah who, the Bible tells us, fasted in the mountains, the one before receiving the Ten Commandments, the other the Word of God.


Our period of Lent invites us too to prepare for Easter for 40 days (46 actually, but Sundays aren't included) - maybe by reflection or by abstinence; sometimes people give up something (chocolate? alcohol?) or decide to take on something new to benefit others. And this is a very good time to reflect on our relationship with God.

The word **Lent** isn't itself religious; in Old English it signified 'spring season' as the days were lengthening, but fasting before Easter became a custom very early in the Christian Church. It starts on **Ash Wednesday**; the ashes, traditionally prepared by the burning of the palm leaves from the previous year, are a sign of repentance after the 'shriving' on **Shrove Tuesday**. In the medieval world fasting often meant giving up dairy produce (which we still observe on the day we make our pancakes) and meat; in some – especially Catholic - countries, they still say farewell (*vale*) to their stores of flesh (*carne*) with exuberant *carnivals*. For us the music in our main church services tends to be more restrained during Lent - our hymns more contemplative, organ voluntaries more subdued, the 'Gloria' replaced by penitence, no Alleluias sung; but, in forty days' time, how much more meaningful will be our "**HE IS RISEN**; **ALLELUIA**".
